COLLECT OF THE WEEK

DID YOU KNOW?

What does it mean to be justified by faith? It is through God's grace (undeserved love and mercy) He sent His begotten Son to justify (save) us. Through Jesus' death on the cross, we are now seen as holy (without sin). It is our faith in God's promise, not works (things that we do), that gives us salvation (eternally with God).

MONDAY — THE PSALM

Read Psalm 33:12-22

What is God's steadfast love?

God's steadfast love is His unfailing love, mercy, and goodness toward us.

What contrasts does David make between the earthly rulers and God?

The rulers (the world) can not offer any real help in our salvation, only God can save us. We are to ask God for help in all things. God is the protector (shield) of His people.

TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Genesis 15:1-6

Who came to Abram in a vision?

The LORD God

What did God promise Abram? (verse 4)

Abram will have a son of his own, an heir. Abram had great faith that the Lord Keeps His promises.

What does God compare Abram's descendants to?

Abram will have as many descendants as there are stars.

WEDNESDAY — THE GOSPEL

Read Luke 16:19-31

Describe Lazarus and the rich man.

Lazarus was a poor man who was covered in sores and desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table. (verse 20)

The rich man was clothed in purple and fine lines, he feasted sumptuously (luxuriously fine or large meals) and every day. (verse 19)

What happened to Lazarus when he died? (verse22)

The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's side in heaven.

What happened to the rich man when he died? (verses 22–23)

The rich man was buried and then tormented in Hades (hell).

Why does the rich man want Lazarus to visit his five brothers? (verse 27)

The rich man wants his five brothers to be warned so they do not end up being tormented in hell as he is.

Lazarus was not sent to warn the brothers to repent. "If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone (Lazarus) should rise from the dead."

THURSDAY — THE EPISTLE

Read 1 John 4:16-21

What are the two kinds of love? And, what do they mean?

Love of $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ — We are to love $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ with all our heart, mind, and strength.

Love of the neighbor — We are to love our neighbor as we love ourself.

How do we know God loves us?

God sent His only begotten Son into the world to die for our sins.

CATECHISM CONNECTION

What is the connection of the Fifth Commandment and Trinity I?

We are commanded by God to help and love our neighbor.

You shall not murder. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and support him in every physical need.
