## TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Jeremiah 23:16-29

What is the Lord warning Christians of?

False prophets and false doctrine — False prophets attack the faith of the faithful. They falsely portray God. Sometimes they come right out and deny the Holy Trinity. They deny that Jesus is true God. They deny that the Holy Spirit is a distinct Person. Christians worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity (Athanasian Creed) as the Bible teaches. (Isaiah 42:1; Matthew 3:16-17; 1 John 5:7 NKJV). God is One divine Essence and Three distinct Persons.

### WEDNESDAY — THE GOSPEL

Read Matthew 7:15-23

How can we recognize false prophets?

Jesus tells you, "You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thornbushes or figs from thistles?" Trees yield fruit according to its kind. (Genesis 1:12c-d). That's how God made trees on the third day of creation, and that's what Jesus explains, when He says: "every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit."

The trouble with recognizing false prophets is that they never look like a false prophet; they don't come with a warning label. The wolf is clothed like a sheep, the false prophet is dressed in piety and good works. You will not be able to recognize a false prophet from the outside. False prophets are identified by what they teach.

Compare the fruit from false prophets and true prophets.

There is nothing more poisonous or deadly than false teaching — the false words of false prophets. False teaching Kills. Eternally. Because it destroys faith.

Instead of bringing death, the true prophet brings the Word of eternal life, the Word of salvation, the Word of Jesus, the Word of forgiveness. For these are the Words that Jesus would have you hear. If the words of the false prophet is poison, the Words of the Lord are medicine, the medicine of immortality. If the words of the false prophet bring death, the Word of the Lord brings life and salvation.
