COLLECT OF THE WEEK

MONDAY — THE PSALM

Read Psalm 84

Where is God's dwelling place today?

The Church is God's dwelling place. It is where the gospel is publicly preached, the holy Sacraments are administered, and where His saints gather for worship.

What does verse 5 mean?

Blessed are those who live their lives according to God's Word — in both faith and trust in God above all things.

How is God our sun and shield? (verse 11)

God provides everything we need and continues to take care of us.

As you have learned to confess from the Catechism: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still take care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. (SC. II: 1)

TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Genesis 28:10–17

Describe Jacob's dream.

Jacob dreamed that there was a ladder (or stairway) going from earth to heaven with angels of God ascending and descending upon it.

The LORD was at the top of the ladder. He said that He is the God of Abraham and Isaac, and promised that Jacob's offspring would bless all the families of the earth. Christ is the greatest descendant of Jacob, and He fulfills God's promise through His death on the cross.

What ought we learn from Jacob's vision?

There are heavenly forces at work; there is much that we do not see, that we do not know or understand. But the truth behind these unseen and unknown things is that God, out of His abundant mercy and grace, is bringing you to the place where you might hear His holy Word, believe it, and be saved.

WEDNESDAY — THE GOSPEL

Read Matthew 9:1–8

How are we like the paralytic (a person who can not move or feel parts of their body)?

Just as the paralytic could not walk to Jesus on his own, neither can you.

As you have learned to confess from the Catechism: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. (SC. II: 3).

Why did the scribes accuse Jesus of blasphemy (speaking falsely about or insulting God)? (verses 2–6)

Jesus told the paralytic that his "sins were forgiven." The scribes thought Jesus was claiming to do something that only God could do, as only the "Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins."

What authority did Jesus give to men? (verse 8)

Jesus gave the power to forgive sins through the Office of the Holy Ministry.

THURSDAY — THE EPISTLE

Read Ephesians 4:22–28

What is the "old self" is a reference too?

The Old Adam is corrupt with sin and evil desires that we inherit because of Adam's fall into sin.

How is the "new self" created after the likeness of God?

In Baptism, the Old Adam (old self) is drowned, with the New Adam (new man or self) emerging in true righteousness and holiness.

CATECHISM CONNECTION

What is the connection of Confession with Explanation and Trinity XIX?

We believe that when we confess our sins we are to also receive forgiveness from the pastor as from God Himself.

The pastor is to pronounce absolution (forgiveness) for the pastor stands in the stead and by the command of God to absolve sinners who repent of their sins. Pastors are charged to deal with those who repent of their sins and wish to do better just as Christ Himself would deal them – freely forgiving them.
