MONDAY — THE PSALM

Read Psalm 146

Why should we only trust in the Lord? (verses 6-7)

God is our Creator, He made all things. He richly and daily provides all that is needed. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. (SC: The First Article of the Creed)

The Lord is ever faithful, ever true, ever merciful and kind. He keeps His promises. He has said that He will work all things together for the everlasting good in all who believe in Him. (Romans 8:28).

List some of the ways the Lord proves Himself trustworthy. (verses 5–9)

Verse 6 — The Lord is forever faithful, He Keeps His word and promises.

Verse 7 — The Lord gives justice to the oppressed, feeds the hungry, and releases believers from bondage.

Verse 8 — The Lord gives sight to the blind, He lifts up those who are down, and He loves the righteous.

Verse ${\bf q}$ — The Lord protects us, He provides for the widow and fatherless, and He brings ruin to the wicked.

TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Isaiah 29:17-24

How did God show mercy to Israel? (verses 17–23)

Verse 17 — God turns everything around, a foreshadow of the humble being exalted and the proud being abased.

Verse 18 — God opens the ears and eyes to the Lord, the people are able to understand His words

Verses 19-21 — The exalted will be humbled and the humble will be exalted

Verses 22–23 — Jacob would no longer be ashamed, but see his children were brought to faith and praise $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$

How did God's people react to everything He did for them? (verses 23–24)

God's people (believers) will stand in awe of the God; they will worship and praise Him.

WEDNESDAY — THE GOSPEL

Read Mark 7:31-37

Describe the man who was brought to Jesus by the Sea of Galilee. (verse 32)

The man was deaf and had a speech impediment. This man brought before the Lord could neither hear nor speak clearly. He could not hear the Gospel with his ears. He could not confess Christ with his lips. Even though he desired to hear and speak rightly, he was unable, and helpless to cure himself.

What happened? What word did Jesus say to the man? What does the word mean? (verses 34–37)

Jesus Christ saved him. For while his tongue was silent and his ears stopped, his heart was moved to faith. The Lord loosens the tongue which the devil had tied and opens the ears that Satan had stopped, and He does so, with a single word: Ephphatha.

Ephphatha, it means: Be opened; be released.

By that strong Word, the Lord broke the twisted gates that blocked the man's ears, and made straight the tongue distorted by sin. The Mouth that spoke the Words, "Let there be..." and there was (Genesis 1:3, 6-7, 9, 11, 14-15, 20-21, 24 26-27), the Mouth from which holy Breath animated the first man (Genesis 2:7), the Mouth from which holy Breath breathed the Apostolic Office into Eleven bewildered disciples giving them the power to bind and loose sin (John 20:22-23), the Mouth of Christ also speaks a Word of Promise to you: Everyone who believes in the Son [of God] has everlasting life (John 3:36), and [He] will raise [you] up on the last day. (John 6:40c). [Everyone who] believes in [Him], as the Scriptures [say], out of his heart will flow rivers of living water. (John 7:38).

THURSDAY — THE EPISTLE

Read Romans 10:9-17

Where does faith come from? (verse 17)

Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the Word of Christ.
