

TUESDAY — THE OLD TESTAMENT Read Deuteronomy 10:12–21

What did Moses mean when he told the Israelites to circumcise their hearts? (verse 16)

Martin Luther wrote: "Therefore by this statement Moses destroys that occasion for sin against the First Commandment which arises from the observance of circumcision and all the works of the Law... But he does this that they may know that the Law is fulfilled, not by works of the Law but from the circumcision of the heart, and that such works are truly good only when they proceed, not from the compulsion of the Law but from the heart which was circumcised before... Otherwise works produce nothing." (Luther's Works, Vol. 9. pgs. 110-111).

What are some of the reasons listed in this lesson that we should fear, love, and serve God? (verses 14–21)

What is the second great commandment? (verse 39)

What is the first great commandment? (verses 36–38)

How can David's son (his heir, descended from his body) be at the same time David's master and Lord? (verses 41–46)
