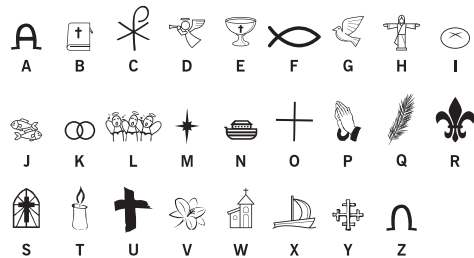
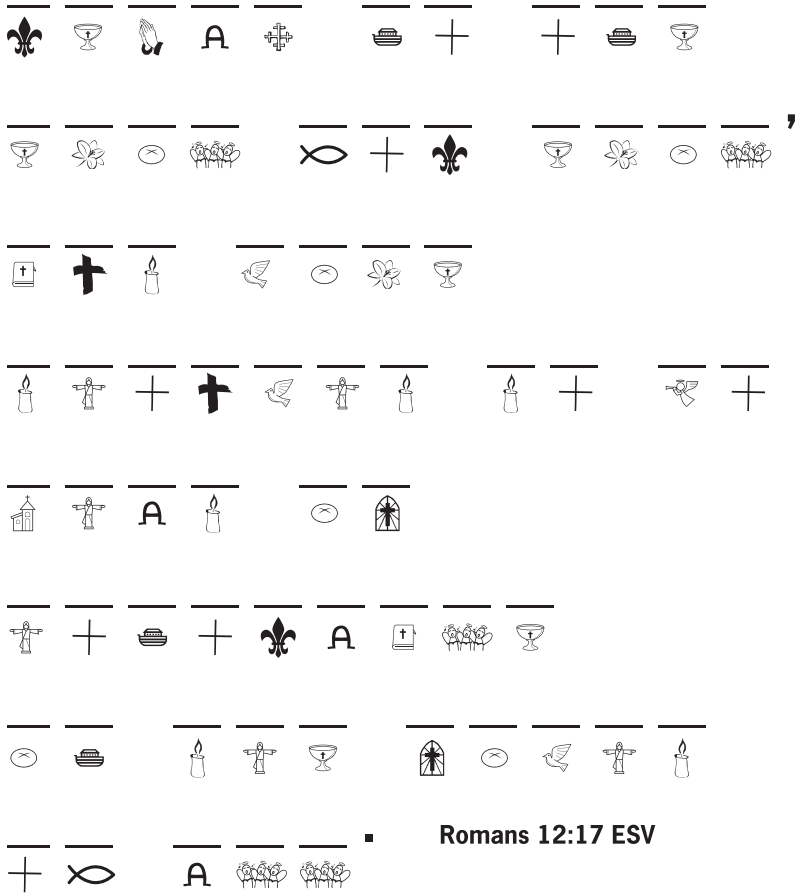

INTROIT

Psalm 27:3-4a; antiphon: Psalm 27:1-2
